AB 1670 (Beall) signed by the Governor—On September 29, Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger signed AB 1670, a City sponsored bill authored by Assemblymember Jim Beall on behalf of the City. AB 1670 authorizes the California Transportation Commission (CTC) to relinquish to the City of San Jose specified portions of State Routes (SR) 82 and 130 and becomes effective January 1, 2011. Next steps include DOT completing agreement negotiations with Caltrans related to the relinquishment and project funding as well as final approval by the CTC for the relinquishment. Federal Update from Patton Boggs LLP -- Congress passed a "clean" Continuing Resolution (CR) on Wednesday before adjourning until after the mid-term elections. The CR will enable the federal government to run through December 3. With the exception of funding for federal air marshals, border security personnel, offshore oil drilling oversight, and several foreign aid commitments, the measure continues funding for federal programs at FY2010 enacted levels (the additions are fully offset through the rescission of unobligated balances). Additionally, the CR extends the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) block grant at the current level through the length of the CR. The remainder of the federal legislative agenda will be taken up after Congress returns on November 15. Given that Members will reconvene for only a week before again adjourning for the Thanksgiving recess, they will focus on organization and administrative necessities in that first week and legislative activity will not resume until they return on November 29.

What happens next will depend, to some extent, on what happens in the election. While there are a number of items outstanding, Democratic leaders have already identified their top three priorities for the lame duck session: (1) an omnibus FY2011 appropriations package; (2) extension of tax cuts for the middle class; and (3) a strategic arms control treaty with Russia. Other pending legislation, such as the tax extenders bill and the FY2011 Defense authorization will be completed if time allows. With Republicans and Democrats strongly divided on the tax cuts, debate on this issue alone could monopolize the remaining legislative days of this Congressional session. The City's advocacy team in Washington D.C. will continue to monitor and keep the City

HHPZ's Fall/Winter Operating Schedule—In October, Happy Hollow Park and Zoo (HHPZ) will remain open daily where customers can enjoy the “Fall Fun in the Hollow” activities including breakfast with Danny the Dragon and a pumpkin patch. HHPZ will be closed on Mondays and Tuesdays from November through February. In addition, in December, the park will be closed on weekdays during December 1-17. Launch of SCCHousingSearch.org—The City of San Jose, in partnership with the County of Santa Clara, has launched SCCHousingSearch.org – a new affordable rental housing listing for San Jose and Santa Clara County. Parks Capital Grants Program Lands Prestigious Harvard 'Bright Idea' Recognition—On September 23, the Parks, Recreation & Neighborhood Services (PRNS) Capital Grants Program received a ***Bright Idea*** designation for its Community Grants Team from the Harvard Kennedy School Ash Center for Democratic Governance and Innovation. The PRNS Capital Grants Unit created the Grants Team to enable PRNS, other City departments, community-based organizations and community members to work together in competing for grant opportunities. The department completes its grant applications with active community engagement, which greatly increases its grant-writing output and sense of ownership in park development projects. These efforts have resulted in the City receiving park funds of \$3.1 million in 2007-2008 and \$6.1 million in 2008-2009 and \$2.61 million in 2009-2010 with several pending applications for approximately \$75 million from 2009-2010. Airport's Modernization Project Named Best of 2010 by California Construction Magazine—A statewide competition sponsored by California Construction Magazine annually recognizes construction and design excellence in Northern and Southern California. An independent jury of industry experts in design and construction judged more than 135 nominated projects and named award winners based on criteria including project management and client service, safety, design, and functionality. Mineta San Jose International Airport Terminal Area Improvement Program was nominated by Fentress Architects and was selected as the Overall Top Project for Northern California for 2010. Winners will be featured in the December 2010 issue of California Construction and will be honored at an awards breakfast in December in San Francisco. Terminal B Concourse Achieves LEED Silver Certification—The US Green Building Council has certified the new Terminal B Concourse as LEED Silver in recognition of the Airport's significant commitment to environmentally sustainable design and construction. The 380,000-square-foot, \$342 million structure was the first major element of SJC's comprehensive \$1.3

billion modernization program. Sustainability features in Terminal B Concourse include the extensive use of natural light with windows and skylights that take advantage of Silicon Valley's sunny climate. The outer layer of the building's exterior acts as a shading device that protects the inner core of the building and enables it to operate with greater energy efficiency. Other efficiency measures include occupancy sensors for lighting, a programmable lighting control system, high efficiency programmable "smart" heating and cooling system, and water conservation plumbing. The construction of Terminal B Concourse used recycled material as much as practical, and more than half of the wood used in the project was Forest Stewardship Council Certified. City Recognized for Participation in 2010 Census—On September 28, the City received recognition from the United States Census Bureau for its participation in the 2010 Census. The Census is conducted every 10 years and is vital in achieving proper representation in Congress; receiving eligible funding for community programs, services and facilities which leads to the improvement to the quality of life within the communities. Hawaiian Airlines Celebrates its 5th Anniversary of Service at SJC—On September 30, Hawaiian Airlines celebrated its fifth anniversary of direct service from Silicon Valley to Honolulu with Hawaiian music and dancers. Councilmember Nancy Pyle congratulated Hawaiian on behalf of the Mayor and Council. Hawaiian launched service from San Jose on October 1, 2005, and the flight was Hawaiian's first in the Silicon Valley market. The successful service features the wide-body Boeing 767 aircraft configured with 18 first-class seats and 234 economy seats, and is scheduled to provide travelers with an afternoon arrival in Honolulu and time to catch convenient flights to other Hawaiian islands. New Airport Concessions Open at Terminal A—Airport concessionaire Hudson Group opened a new Hudson News and EuroCafé, a new pre-security newsstand and café, this week in the Terminal A Baggage Claim area that features fresh-roasted gourmet coffee, pastries and sandwiches, including freshly baked goods supplied by San Jose's Bijan Bakery. The pre-security location meets a long-expressed need for concession services for passengers and visitors outside of the secure area of the airport. In addition, another Sunset News stand also has opened in the north end of Terminal A next to Gate 4 that provides books, news, gifts and coffee. 
